<u>Trustee Weimer moved to approve the minutes from Regular Meeting of April 17, 2018, 05-15-18-01, seconded by Trustee Campbell and passed with 3 ayes.</u>

Fiscal Officer Balsinger gave the financial report through April 30, 2018 - Total Fund Balances available for Milton Township are \$2,163,861.40. The General Fund balance is \$454,539.85, which represents approximately 21% of all funds available. The Fiscal Officer asked for approval of payments by Warrants #29996 through #30034 and EFT #119 thru #196 totaling \$59,644.93. Receipts to date are \$443,506.32 as of April 30, 2018. YTD Expenditure as of 4/30/18 is \$302,904.39. Ms. Balsinger also reported all departments are within their budgets and received their departmental reports.

Trustee Campbell moved to approve the financial report, and to approve the payments by Warrants #29996 through #30034 and EFT #119 thru #196 totaling \$59,644.93., 05-15-18-02, seconded by Trustee Tomaino and passed with 3 ayes.

# **DEPARTMENT REPORTS**

#### **ROAD & CEMETERY DEPARTMENTS:**

### **Road Report:**

- 1. Parkview project completed total cost with materials was \$7,849.22
- 2. Estimate for repairing broken culvert pipe on Summerset and Beachview is \$4,100 plus new sign and post. Dave has contacted and received a claim number for this damage from Republic Waste Insurance Company.
- 3. Stolen signs have been replaced.
- 4. Patching of roads is moving slow because of weather.
- 5. Community Building property has only been getting half mowed due to a misunderstanding by Cross Brothers.
- 6. The windows are falling out at Community Building and need repaired.

<u>Trustee Weimer moved to pay Bissiri to do the repairs to the culvert on Summerset and Beachwood and submit estimate for prior approval from insurance company, 05-15-18-03, seconded by Trustee Campbell and passed with 3 ayes.</u>

#### **FIRE DEPARTMENT:**

Chief Maynard reported April had a total of 24 calls. 20 in Milton Township and 4 others. Calls were -0 structure fires, 0 accident, 13 medical, 0 grass fire, 0 carbon monoxide, 3 trees/wires down, 0 car fire, 0 water emergency/rescue, 4 mutual aid, 1 burning complaints, 3 alarm activations, 0 gas leak and 0 other.115 total calls for 2018. Total Medical Transports in March by MFD -6.

- 1. All bills have been submitted for payment to the Fiscal Officer.
- 2. Chief Maynard will purchase candy for everyone to have for the Memorial Day Parade.

- 3. Grant submitted to Ohio Department of EMS for new IPads to assist with medical reporting, Chief said he received notice that they were awarded 2 units. Chief drove to Columbus to pick up the units and they should be in service soon with some in house training on the units.
- 4. Don Booth requested if he plant some type of shrubbery along Mahoning Ave across from ODNR would the fire department get involved in watering these plants until they can take root. Trustees are not comfortable using Township resources and services to water plants and asked the chief to put the request into the school and see if a student or organization would do this as a community service project.
- 5. Chief received a call from the Sherriff's office requesting the department to participate in the mock Active Shooter drill at the Jackson Milton Schools on June 18<sup>th</sup>. The department would provide fire and EMS coverage for the drill.
- 6. Ken Huber requested the Fire department to burn his house on 1737 Raymond. Chief has to call him to explain the rules have changed for burning homes and the cost is excessive and the requirements from the state is they have to have certified trainers on site and they charge an hourly rate. Chief is going to decline his offer due to these factors.
- 7. Chief submitted a letter to the owner of the Lake Milton Campground with a few questions regarding the plans submitted to him for inspection by zoning.
- 8. Chief would like to purchase cones with LED lights to use as aid in landing a helicopter that is called in for an emergency. This will then be submitted as part of our MORE Grant application for possible reimbursement. The cost is \$202

<u>Trustee Tomaino moved to purchase the safety cones with LED lights for a total cost of \$202.05-15-18-04</u>, seconded by Trustee Campbell and passed with 3 ayes.

9. TSI charges \$550 to service the large apparatus. This includes oil change and replacement of fuel and oil filters. Fire has four trucks that will need serviced.

<u>Trustee Tomaino moved to service one truck a month at the \$550 cost in rotation then trucks will be serviced once a year after that. 05-15-18-05, seconded by Trustee Weimer and passed with 3 ayes.</u>

- 10. The old Jeep has been set out for sale with no offers. The Edinburgh Auction is this coming weekend and we can take the Jeep with title and they will sell as is on consignment and be done with the vehicle. Trustees agree this would be the best option at this point.
- 11. Chief Maynard would like to commend is volunteers for a job well done. While the chief was out of town his firefighters were available, responded and handle 15 calls. Job well done.

## **POLICE DEPARTMENT**

1. Chief Van Dyke has five individuals that have made it through the employment venting thus far. Chief would like a provisional hire to be able to move to the next step in testing.

Trustee Tomaino moved to offer a provisional hire to Anna Mangan, Noah Gerchak, Anthony Crabtree, Torey Frame and Anthony Roth. Their hire is contingent on results of their final employment testing. 05-15-18-06, seconded by Trustee Campbell and passed with 3 ayes.

2. School District needs informed that will we will not be renewing the SRO Grant.

- 3. Chief would like to acknowledge Officer Cordell for an exceptional job when responding to a suicidal female on the roof of a house. Officer Cordell was able to establish a good rapport and talk the individual down off the roof.
- 4. Chief is requesting to purchase ammunition in the amount of \$2,209.55 from Vance's Law Enforcement.
- 5. The Police Department will be holding training on May 30 in Jackson Township and June 16<sup>th</sup> at Milton Fire Department for CPR, AED & Naloxone.

<u>Trustee Tomaino moved to approve the purchase of ammunition from Vance's in the amount of \$2,209.55, 05-15-18-07,</u> seconded by Trustee Weimer and passed with 3 ayes.
